1.	<i>General</i>	
1.1	Instruction on the location and use of all Emergency and Safety Equipment carried on the airplane	
1.2	Instruction on the location and use of all types of exits	
1.3	Security procedures.	
2.	<i>Fire and Smoke Training</i>	
2.1	Emphasis on the responsibility of crew member to deal promptly with emergencies involving fire and smoke and, in particular, emphasis on the importance of identifying the actual source of the fire.	
2.2	The importance of informing the Commander (<i>flight crew member</i>) immediately, as well as the specific actions necessary for coordination and assistance, when fire or smoke is discovered .	
2.3	The necessity for frequent checking of potential fire-risk areas including toilets, and the associated smoke detectors .	
2.4	The classification of fires and the appropriate type of extinguishing agents and procedures for particular fire situations .	
2.5	The techniques of application of extinguishing agents, the consequences of misapplication, and of use in a confined space including practical training in fire-fighting and in the donning and use of smoke protection equipment used in aviation.	
2.6	The general procedures of ground - based emergency services at aerodromes .	
3.	<i>Survival Training</i>	
3.1	Principles of survival in hostile environments (<i>e. g. polar, desert, jungle, sea</i>).	
3.2	Water theoretical - survival training which shall include the donning (<i>actual, if available</i>) and use of personal flotation equipment in water and the use of door, with similar equipment, as well as actual practice in water.	
4.	<i>Actual operation</i>	
4.1	Actual operation of all types of exits.	
4.2	The effects of smoke in an enclosed area and actual use of all relevant equipment in a simulated smoke - filled environment	
4.3	Demonstration in the use of the life - raft(s) where fitted.	
4.4	Actual donning of a lifejacket, actual donning of protective breathing equipment where fitted .	
4.5	Actual handling of fire extinguishers

4.6	Actual fire -fighting using equipment representative of that carried in the airplane on an actual or simulated fire .
4.7	Actual handling of pyrotechnics, real or simulated, where fitted

Every year the Emergency and Safety Equipment Procedure Training Programme complete. Emergency and Safety Equipment Checking conducted in an airplane with suitable alternative training equipment / device.
